

**SUPPLEMENTAL EMERGENCY ORDER NUMBER ONE FOR THE CITY OF
LAKEWAY ISSUED PURSUANT TO DISASTER DECLARATION**

WHEREAS, by proclamation issued March 16th, 2020, I, Sandra L. Cox, Mayor of Lakeway declared a local state of disaster for the City of Lakeway resulting from:

Risk of imminent threat to public health from the novel coronavirus, COVID-19;
and

WHEREAS, the local state of disaster was extended by the City Council on March 16, 2020 to remain in place until such time as the Mayor determines the state of local disaster may be rescinded; and

WHEREAS, Governor Abbott has issued a series of Executive Orders to address the emergency created by the novel coronavirus pandemic effecting a shelter in place condition for the State; and

WHEREAS, the Travis County Judge also issued a series of Orders to address the emergency created by the novel coronavirus pandemic at the County level effecting a shelter in place condition for the County; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Cox, acting as Emergency Management Director issued an Order on March 24, 2020 to address the novel coronavirus pandemic within the City of Lakeway effecting a shelter in place condition for the City; and

WHEREAS, The novel coronavirus that causes 2019 Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) is easily transmitted through person to person contact, especially in group settings, and it is essential that the spread of the virus be slowed to protect the ability of public and private health care providers to handle the influx of new patients and safeguard public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, Because of the risk of the rapid spread of the virus, there is a need to protect the most vulnerable members of the community; and

WHEREAS, The Orders issued by the Governor, County, and Mayor prohibit dining in restaurants; and

WHEREAS, Many restaurants are remaining open (as permitted by those Orders) to help provide food to the residents of Lakeway by offering to-go, curbside pickup, and home delivery of their offerings; and

WHEREAS, Many of those restaurants offering such to-go, curbside pickup, and home delivery services are installing temporary portable signs or banners to direct residents to their establishments and to advertise these new services implemented to aid the community in this emergency condition; and

WHEREAS, Lakeway City ordinances, including but not limited to 26.04.002 and 26.04.004 prohibit such temporary portable signs and banners; and

WHEREAS, The Orders issued by the Governor, County, and Mayor identify certain Essential Services that must be kept functioning during the time period that the shelter in place Orders are in effect; and

WHEREAS, The persons who are employed to maintain and operate the Essential Services are most at risk for contracting COVID-19 due to their employment; and

WHEREAS, Many such essential personnel are choosing to self-quarantine to keep their families and acquaintances safe from any exposure to the novel coronavirus the essential personnel might incur as a result of their employment and job duties; and

WHEREAS, Some of the essential personnel are choosing to self-quarantine by residing in recreational vehicles or travel trailers parked at their residences; and

WHEREAS, Lakeway City ordinances, including but not limited to 30.04.001 prohibit or limit the parking of recreational vehicles and travel trailers in residential zoning districts; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Cox has determined certain circumstances prohibited by ordinance within the City of Lakeway should be permitted during the shelter in place Orders in effect; and

WHEREAS, Due to the various shut-down Orders in place numerous residents are currently unable to pay their solid waste service bills in a timely fashion and are therefore subject to late fees and possible suspension of their service under Article 20.02 of the Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, The City Building Commission has generally reviewed and investigated view-blocking determinations in the City's View Protection Conditional Overlay under Section 30.03.023 of the Code of Ordinances by traveling as a group to the impacted residences and the site of the proposed construction; and


WHEREAS, That CBC procedure is currently not permitted due to the requirement to practice social distancing.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in the Office of Mayor by Texas Government Code Chapter 418 and Article 1.05 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lakeway, Mayor Cox issues the following Supplemental Order:

1. The March 24, 2020, Order issued by Mayor Cox is maintained in force and effect, and nothing in this Supplemental Order is intended to amend or modify the March 24, 2020 Order.
2. Until ordered otherwise, or until the state of disaster and emergency is lifted, restaurants within Lakeway are permitted to post temporary, portable signs or banners advertising that they offer food to-go, curbside pickup services, and home delivery services. Additionally, such temporary, portable signs or banners are permitted to identify where customers may park or wait for food to be delivered by the restaurant.

3. Until ordered otherwise, or until the state of disaster and emergency is lifted, residents may park recreational vehicles or travel trailers in their driveways without a limit on the number of days it may so remain.
4. Until ordered otherwise, Solid Waste Service late fees will not accrue, and individual accounts will not be suspended for non-payment.
5. Until ordered otherwise, any necessary site visits to conduct a view-blocking analysis under the View Protection Conditional Overlay shall be conducted by each commissioner separately, from the right-of-way and prior to the scheduled meeting. Site visits will not be conducted during the CBC meeting as is the case currently. For the purpose of considering views from any neighboring property, the CBC shall rely upon video and photographs from major living spaces submitted by affected neighbors prior to the scheduled CBC meeting.
6. Pursuant to Section 1.05.035 of the Lakeway Code of Ordinances, this Supplemental Order Number One supersedes and overrides all existing City ordinances, orders, rules, and regulations insofar as the latter may be inconsistent with the terms of this Supplemental Order.
7. This Supplemental Order Number One shall be effective until it is rescinded, superseded, or amended pursuant to applicable law.
6. Emergency. This Supplemental Order Number One shall take effect immediately upon filing with the City Secretary, and it is accordingly so ordained.
